

PriCARE/CARIÑO Program Overview

- 6 session, virtual group for parents living in Philly
 - o Formally in person
 - Also recruit from UNC
- Child must be 2-6 years of age
- Intentions:
 - Teaches positive parenting skills
 - Positively impact children's behavior (whether they have misbehaviors/do not)
 - Decrease negative behaviors
 - Strengthen parent-child relationship through play
 - o Provide tools to better communicate with child
 - o Increase compliance
 - Stigma



PriCARE Program Aims

• Goals for children:

- Reinforce children's positive behaviors
- strengthens the relationship between caregiver and child
- Less anxiety symptoms

Goals for parents:

- more empathy
- Encourage child independence
- Lessen parental stress
- Reduce child maltreatment/less corporal punishment

- Small training groups, encouraging participation
- Live feedback
- Give tools you need to communicate with your kids that's more understandable and appropriate for their age

Benefits of Play

- 3-5 minutes of child-led 1-on-1 play
 - o critical for children's development
 - Routine
 - O Don't use as reward/punishment





Language

- Learning words/concepts
- Rules of conversation

Thinking

- Problem solving skills
- Planning ahead
- Developing new skills

Physical Health


- Jumping
- Balancing
- Lifting
- running

Social & Emotional

- Empathy
- Interacting
 - Sharing
 - Cooperating
 - Taking turns

Significance

- 1 in 5 U.S. children meet diagnostic criteria for behavioral/emotional disorders
 - Delays academic, relationship, social, and emotional skills
 - Increased child maltreatment and parental stress
 - Key factor: parenting styles
 - Permissive, uninvolved, authoritarian, authoritative
- Authoritative parenting
 - o Demanding, responsive
 - Reduces severity of misbehaviors
 - Decreases risk of mental health problems



Permissive

- Child-driven
- Rarely gives or enforces rules
- Overindulges child to avoid conflict

Authoritative

- Solves problems together with child
- Sets clear rules and expectations
- Open communication and natural consequences

Neglectful

- Uninvolved or absent
- Provides little nurturance or guidance
- Indifferent to child's social-emotional and behavioral needs

Authoritarian

- Parent-driven
- Sets strict rules and punishment
- One-way communication, with little consideration of child's socialemotional and behavioral needs

PriCARE Study Aims

- **Primary objective:** evaluate the effectiveness of PriCARE/CARIÑO to reduce
 - (a) CPS investigations of suspected CM
 - **(b)** Child maltreatment risk.
- **Secondary objective:** measure the impact of PriCARE/CARIÑO on
 - (a) harsh parenting
 - **(b)** parenting stress
 - **(c)** child behavior problems
 - **(d)** the quality of the parent-child relationship.



Study Methods Overview

- RCT
- 2000 current child dyads, will be randomized for treatment
- Multiple measures; collected at baseline and follow-up
 - Parenting skills
 - Child misbehaviors
 - Parenting stress
 - Child abuse potential
 - Video-taped interactions
 - DPICS
 - Measured at 2-time points
 - Randomized to control or intervention
 - Needed to determine effectiveness



Recruitment

- Referrals
- Social Media
- Clinic Presentations
- Flyers

INCLUSION / EXCLUSION CRITERIA

Parent

Inclusion Criteria

- Parent of guardian of eligible child
- Age 18 years or older
- Has technology to join virtual PriCARE
- Lives in same household as child at least 50% of time

Exclusion Criteria

- Non-English or Non-Spanish speaking
- Prior PriCARE participant
- Not available during time
 PriCARE is offered

Child

Inclusion Criteria

- Patient at participating CHOP primary care site
- · Age 2 to 6 years at enrollment
- · Can use 2 word phrases
- Medicaid, CHIP or no insurance
- · Live in Philadelphia County


Exclusion Criteria

- Receiving individual mental health treatment
- Diagnosis of autism, ADHD
 or ODD
- Injurious behaviors


Considering lowering age to 18

Pre-screen potential participants by inclusion and exclusion criteria; +/- informed consent

<u>Visit 1 (Informed Consent/Baseline)</u>

Data Collection (Demographics, PHQ9, GAD7, ACE, ECBI, PSI, CTS, PS, BCAP, DPICS



Randomize

Control N=966

Visit 2 (Follow-Up)


Data Collection (ECBI, PSI, CTS, PS, BCAP, DPICS)

Findings/Outcomes

CAREGIVERS: THERAPEUTIC ATTITUDES

FEEDBACK

- Data is still in progress
- Results from prior RCTs
- Therapeutic attitudes
- Reduction in negative child behaviors, parental stress, positive parenting, CPS calls



- > 90% enjoyed PriCARE
- > 76% learned new discipline techniques.
- > 80% experienced improved relationship with child.
 - > 74% of caregivers reported seeing behaviors improve in their children.


